

# Streamline COVID-19 Vaccine Administration and Management

Below are more ways we're helping customers streamline vaccination administration and management as the vaccination effort gains momentum.

## 1. Protect your COVID-19 vaccine supply

A hospital in Hampton, VA integrated its refrigerator temperature-monitoring system with its Vocera communication system. If a pharmaceutical refrigerator deviates from the proper temperature, an alert will be sent directly from the temperature-monitoring system to the attending pharmacist's Vocera [Smartbadge](#), [Badge](#), or [smartphone app](#).

## 2. Communicate with offsite COVID-19 immunization and testing stations.

It's not uncommon for vaccines to be administered in parking lots, arenas, and convention centers. With Vocera technology, a hospital's pharmacy, mobile swab, and/or mobile vaccination teams in satellite locations can stay connected with the main campus. If wireless access points are in place, staff at these locations can communicate instantly and directly using their Vocera Smartbadge, Badge, or smartphone app. If a satellite location lacks Wi-Fi, staff can log in to the hospital's Vocera communication system with the Vocera smartphone app.

## 3. Communicate instantly with COVID-19 vaccination teams.

The ability to reach people instantly just by saying the name of a group has been invaluable during the pandemic. Vaccination distribution is no exception. A variety of response groups can be configured from the Vocera Platform Web Console. Examples of groups you could set up include:

- Vaccinators or pharmacists
- Staff distributing vaccines to vaccination areas
- Staff responding to adverse vaccine reactions
- Staff responding in the event of a freezer failure
